Hebden Bridge Flood Alleviation Scheme

August 2021

The Environment Agency is working with Calderdale Council to design and build a Flood Alleviation Scheme for Hebden Bridge.

Ground Investigation Work

As part of ongoing preparation for the flood alleviation schemes in Hebden Bridge, Erringden Hillside and Stubbing Holme Road, BAM Nuttall will be carrying out ground investigation work at a number of areas around the town over the coming months. We have listed below where some initial elements of work will be, however a number of other locations around the town will also see work taking place. Directly impacted properties will be informed ahead of any work taking place.

Old Gate

A significant amount of investigation work is required on Old Gate. To allow the work to be carried out safely, the road will be closed to vehicular access from Monday 13th September, and we expect to reopen on Friday 1st October, subject to no unforeseen delays. All parking bays will be suspended as part of the work. Pedestrian access to properties will be maintained and a diversion route will be clearly sign posted.

New Road & Horsehold Road

A temporary road closure will be in place on New Road and Horsehold Road from Monday 23rd August for approximately two weeks 8am – 5pm Monday – Friday (excluding bank holiday Monday). Access will be maintained where possible with a partial road closure.

Shelf Road

In order for the ground investigation work to be carried out safely, parking will be temporarily suspended on Shelf Road for approximately one week during week commencing Monday 6th September.

Stubbing Holme Road

Temporary traffic lights will be in place on Stubbing Holme Road from Monday 23rd August for approximately three weeks. To minimise disruption, the work will be completed in small sections, commencing near Trinity Street and moving along the road towards Market Street.

From Monday 23rd August into early 2022, the land adjacent to Trinity Street will be used as a material storage area. Residents may experience increased disruption within the first few weeks whilst landscaping work is carried out and materials brought in to prepare the storage area. Once the storage area is established, there will be minimal vehicle movements throughout the working day to tip and collect material.

We will endeavour to keep disruption from all our work to a minimum and we apologise for any inconvenience caused.
